Fire Door Training

Fire doors are found in most of our commercial and multi-storey residential buildings and come in different types, sizes and finishes, incorporating a plethora of hardware and furniture options.

Understanding the fundamentals for fire doors, including the relevant Legislation, the applicable parts of the Building Code of Australia and the interaction with the relevant Australian Standards is paramount to anyone working with fire doors and fire door hardware.
